STOCKTON—George M. Coppernoll, a Stockton farmer, died at 9:45 p.m. Sunday in Freeport Memorial Hospital, where he had been admitted Saturday evening following a stroke he suffered while milking.

Mr. Coppernoll was a member of Stockton Methodist Church, the American Legion and Plum River Masonic Lodge.

He was born in Stockton Township, Jo Daviess County, Dec. 28, 1891, the son of Edward C. and Nellie (Carpenter) Coppernoll.

On Jan. 8, 1920, he married the former Rebecca Townsend in the James B. Townsend home in rural Stockton.

Surviving are his widow; two daughters, Mrs. Melvin (Betty Jean) Albrecht of Elizabeth, and Mrs. Hollis (Esther) DeVoe of Tiffin, Ohio; three sons, Gilbert of rural Stockton, Dean of Mount Pleasant, Iowa, and Norman of Mason City, Iowa; 18 grandchildren; two sisters, Mrs. LeRoy (Ruby) Parker and Mrs. Orrin (Pearl) Gothard, both of Stockton; and two brothers, Frank and John (Jack) Coppernoll, both of Stockton.

Funeral service will be at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at Hermann Funeral Home, Stockton. The Rev. John Ferguson, pastor of the Methodist Church, will officiate. Burial will be in Morseville Cemetery, South of Stockton.
