FREEPORT — Robert Walter Flack, 71, of 1225 S. Float Ave., retired Freeport businessman, died Thursday, April 23, 1993, at Freeport Memorial Hospital.

He operated Flack Sewing Center in Freeport from 1969 until his retirement in 1978.

He had farmed in the Stockton area previously.

A member of the Freeport Moose Lodge, he served as a 4-H club leader in Stockton, and was a Boy Scout Master in Benton, Wis.

An Army sergeant, he served in the infantry during World War II.

Born in Oelwein, Iowa, on Dec. 25, 1921, he was the son of Allen and Alice (Goodrich) Chambers.

When he was 15 months old, he was adopted by Harry and Holly (Petroc) Flack of rural Stockton.

On April 5, 1940, he married Helen K. Dittmar in Manchester, Iowa.
