STOCKTON — Clarence C. Graves, retired Stockton farmer, died early Monday afternoon in Morgan Memorial Home here, where he had been a resident for 1½ years.

Mr. Graves farmed east of Stockton until 1955 when he retired and moved to town. He was a World War I veteran.

He was born Oct. 15, 1887, in Wards Grove Township, Jo Daviess County, son of Jefferson and Temperance (Lear) Graves. He married Ruth Phillips in Phoenix, Ariz., on April 17, 1917.

Surviving are his widow; two sons, Phillip of Irving, Tex., and Rodney of Tustin, Calif.; two daughters, Mrs. Alfred (Margaret) Hoy, Stockton, and Mrs. William (Lois) Bonnet, Kent; 11 grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a brother and two sisters.

Funeral service will be at 2 p.m. Thursday in Hermann Funeral Home with the Rev. Charles Fleck Jr., pastor of Calvary Evangelical United Brethren Church, officiating. Burial will be in Ladies Union Cemetery.
