STOCKTON—Harvey V. Grebner, Stockton Route 2, died at 3:20 p.m. Sunday in a Freeport hospital shortly after admittance. He had been in poor health several years.

He was born March 29, 1893, in Schapville, son of Valentine and Rachel (Winters) Grebner. He married Helen Wilson June 22, 1921, in Schapville.

The couple farmed near Woodbine until 1931 when they moved to the farm near Stockton. Mr. Grebner was a veteran of World War I and a member of Plum River Masonic Lodge, of which he was a past master.

Service will be Tuesday at 2 p.m. in Hermann Funeral Home, where friends may call. Rev. D. James Fitzhugh, Methodist Church pastor, will officiate. Burial, with Masonic rites, will be in Ladies Union Cemetery.
