Miss Elsie Heidenreich

STOCKTON—Miss Elsie Heidenreich, a registered nurse for the past 20 years, died early this morning in the home of her brother, Howard, where she had lived for the past seven months.

Miss Heidenreich was born March 18, 1893, at Woodbine, the daughter of Alex and Clara Lingford Heidenreich. She was a Red Cross nurse during World War I, serving in France. Following the war, she was a missionary in China before moving to Pontiac, Ill., where she practiced nursing for 20 years.

Survivors include three brothers, Howard and Robert, both of Stockton, and Vernon of Boise, Idaho; and a sister, Mrs. Arlan Hershberger of LeMars, Iowa. Four brothers preceded her in death.

She was a member of the Pontiac Evangelical United Brethren Church.

Funeral service will be held Thursday at 2 p.m. in the Grace EUB Church at Woodbine. The Rev. Fred Ogan, pastor at the Pontiac church, assisted by the Rev. George Harem, pastor of the Grace church, will officiate. Burial will be in Woodbine Cemetery.

Funeral arrangements were completed at the Hermann Funeral Home here where friends may call after noon Wednesday.
