STOCKTON—Albert Freeman Heindel, former Stockton resident, died Saturday morning in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Robert (Barbara) Mellendorf, Sterling, following an extended illness.

Mr. Heindel was born July 14, 1895, in Stockton, the son of Albert and Lenora (Rehbock) Heindel. He married the former Gertrude Schroeder.
