Two Carloads Of Teen-Agers Have Crack-Up

FORT DODGE, Iowa (AP) — Two carloads of Fort Dodge teen-agers cracked up in separate accidents Thursday night while returning from a wedding reception at nearby Duncombe, leaving four dead and 10 injured.

Injured in one car which ran through a dead end intersection were Frederick Joseph Wickman, the driver, Tony Sanders and Russell Witte, each 17. Three boys with them were hospitalized.

An hour after this accident a car containing six boys and two girls rolled off U.S. Highway 20 about nine miles east of Fort Dodge. Terry Taylor, 17, was killed and four other boys in this car were taken to the Fort Dodge Lutheran Hospital. The girls and another boy were treated and released.
