EDWARD JASPER JULIUS
STOCKTON — Edward Jasper Julius, 60, lifelong resident of Stockton, died at the home of a sister, Mrs. C. G. Schuckert in Stockton, Wednesday night.

He had been a patient at the Veterans Hospital at Clinton, Iowa, and was visiting in Stockton.

Julius was born Feb. 13, 1895, in Chicago, the son of Edward and Helena Marks Julius.

He was a graduate of Stockton High School and taught school for a time. He was by trade a painter.

Survivors include a brother, Felix Julius of Freeport and the sister. He was a veteran of World War I and a member of the Stockton American Legion.

Funeral services will be Saturday at 9 a. m. in the Hermann Funeral Home and at 9:30 a.m. at the Holy Cross Catholic Church, with the Rev. C. Alfred Dietsch, pastor, officiating.

The Rosary will be said Friday at 8 p.m. at the funeral home.

Burial will be in Holy Cross Cemetery.
