

## Obituary for Donald Eugene Kump

KENT – Donald Eugene Kump of rural Kent, who had been employed as the Dairy Herd Improvement Association tester in Stephenson County since 1968, died Thursday afternoon in Freeport Memorial Hospital following a brief illness.

He also operated a welding shop in Kent for the past 14 years. Mr. Kump, a veteran of the Korean War, was a member of Kent United Methodist Church and Volunteer Fire Department and Pearl City Lions Club and American Legion.

Born Oct. 15, 1927, in Oregon, he was the son of Fred and Dorothy (Drumhella) Kump. He married Lera Hammer Aug. 31, 1952, in Lawton, Okla.

Surviving are his widow; a daughter, Patricia at home; his father of Oregon; six brothers, Harold, Everett, Darrell and Dennis, all of Oregon, David of Rock Island and Raymond of Leaf River; and four sisters, Mrs. Donald (Irma) Moser and Mrs. Daniel (Marietta) Bullard, both of Oregon, and Mrs. Dale (Phyllis) Richardson and Miss Carolyn Kump, both of Sterling. He was preceded in death by his mother.
