STOCKTON – Funeral service for Otto Nagel will be held at 2 p.m. Sunday at Calvary United Methodist Church with the pastor, the Rev. Charles Fleck Jr., officiating. He died Friday morning from an apparent heart attack.

Burial will be in Ladies Union Cemetery in Stockton. Friends may call at the Herman Funeral Home after 7 p.m. tonight, where a Masonic service will be held at 8 p.m.

He was born in Dubuque, Iowa, Sept. 30, 1894, to John and Annie (Henkel) Nagel. He married Ella Derrer July 17, 1918, in rural Mount Carroll.

He was a World War I veteran and farmed in the Pleasant Valley area for more than 50 years.

He was a member of Calvary United Methodist Church, a 50-year member of the Plum River Masonic Lodge in Stockton, Freeport Consistory, Tebala Shrine of Rockford and Stockton American Legion.

Survivors include his wife, Ella; one son, Harold of Stockton; two brothers, John of Stockton and Louis of Mount Carroll; three grandchildren and one great grandchild. He was preceded in death by his parents.
