POMPANO BEACH, Fla. — Donald A. Aurand, 76, of Pompano Beach, Fla., formerly of Kent, died Sunday, Jan. 6, 1991.

He died in a Pompano Beach Hospital, following an extended illness.

He resided in Pompano Beach since 1940 and operated the Walton Hotel with his wife, Louise Fugate Aurand, who died in 1985. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Pompano Beach, a life member of the Pompano Beach Chamber of Commerce and was a World War II Air Force veteran.
