STOCKTON — Douglas Aurand of Stockton, owner and operator of Aurand's Tavern for several years, died this morning in his home following an extended illness.

A graduate of Stockton High School, he was a World War II Marine veteran and a member of the Stockton American Legion.

He was born Dec. 31, 1918, in Stockton, son of Walter and Hazel (Metz) Aurand. He married Jean O'Hara in 1945. She died in 1953.

Surviving are two daughters, Charlotte of Venice, Calif., and Mary at home; a son, John, at home; his former wife, Geraldine of Freeport; a stepdaughter, Mrs. Gerald (Vickie) Broshous of Stockton; three step-grandchildren; his parents of Stockton; and a brother, Donald, also of Stockton. He was also preceded in death by a sister.

Funeral service will be at 2 p.m. Sunday in Hermann Funeral Home, Stockton, with the Rev. Charles Fleck Jr., pastor of Calvary United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial will be in Ladies Union Cemetery.
