## Plane Crash Kills

Lee Aurand, amateur pilot, was instantly killed when his plane crashed Wednesday at 2:45 p. m. in a field west of the Chet Johnson farm and not far from Stockton airport.

Neighbors heard the crash and found Aurand's lifeless body, with chest crushed, while the plane had overturned. He was unmarried and lived with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Aurand on 10th Main street in Stockton.
